

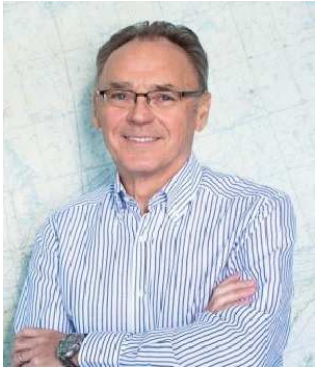

**TERRY KRAUSS, Accredited Consulting Meteorologist**



Terry Krauss received his Masters of Science degree from the University of Alberta (1978), and his PhD in Atmospheric Science from the University of Wyoming (1981) conducting cloud seeding research on Alberta hailstorms using specially instrumented cloud physics aircraft and multi-parameter weather radar measurements.

He has compiled more than 40 years of research and operational cloud seeding experience conducting hail suppression projects in Alberta, the United States, Greece, and Argentina, and rain enhancement projects in the United States, Africa, the Middle East, and Asia.

Dr. Krauss has worked for various Government research organizations and private companies and has consulted for the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), the United Nations Development Program (UNDP), and the World Bank on numerous projects in the World. Dr. Krauss has authored or co-authored more than 50 scientific articles dealing with severe storms, hydrology, hail suppression, and precipitation enhancement.

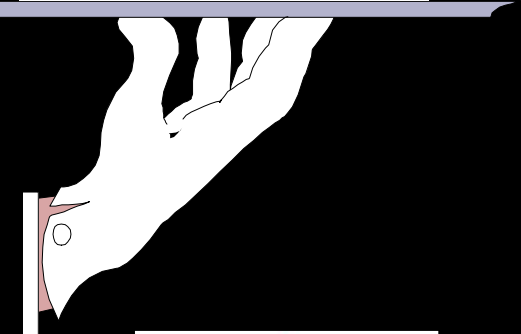
