"FOR I KNOW THE PLANS I HAVE FOR YOU." Jeremiah 29:11a



What do the words "plans to prosper" mean by today's standards? According to Webster's Dictionary, "prosperity" means "the condition of being successful or thriving; especially economic well-being."

For 40 years, Jeremiah passionately and faithfully served as God's spokesman to Judah. Consistently, he urged them to act, but nobody listened or were moved to action. Jeremiah did not achieve material wealth as he underwent extreme deprivation to deliver God's message. Throughout his life, Jeremiah was poor and stood alone. In the eyes of the world, he was not a success.

In God's eyes, however, Jeremiah was one of the most successful people in all of history. Success, as measured by God, involves obedience and faithfulness. Regardless of opposition and personal cost, Jeremiah courageously proclaimed the word of God. He was obedient to his calling.

These words were spoken to a displaced, defeated, depressed group of exiles. They had hung their harps on the willow trees and had lost their song. But with the Lord, things are never hopeless. For I know the plans I have for you...

This life is to be lived and enjoyed as far as we are able, but it is not the future that Jeremiah spoke about. The future God has planned for those who listen and believe is a future beyond death, where there is no pain, no sickness, no suffering, no sorrow, and no more dying. It is that life to which Jesus invites us, and for which He died, that we might live. The plan of God about Jeremiah spoke came to full fruition in Jesus Christ.



CHURCH...A BRIDGE OF LOVE...COMMUNITY

Dr. Robert Lewis, author and church leader gives a fitting description for the church in his book, "The Church of Irresistible Influence." His definition is this: a community of people who...present living proof of a loving God to a watching world.

'Living Proof of a Loving Saviour" has been Bridges of Love's mantra since our inception over 15 years ago. Our mission has been to open windows, assisting churches in serving their communities, in relevant ways. As we provide an open window, we create a door of opportunity.

Dr. Lewis' book written 18 years ago, shares that the church looks across a terrifying and ever widening chasm. At the bottom of the chasm rages the white water of popular sentiment, which increasingly views the church as inconsequential, a sideshow along the interstate of the world's *real traffic*. Does this sense of isolation and powerlessness still pervade much of the contemporary church today?

Often as "engineers of churches," pastors and lay leaders desperately desire to bridge the gap, but when measuring the gorge with the world's mathematics, they come to believe the span is simply too vast. The sheer size of the great chasm is not only intimidating, but it also scares many church leaders into believing that the task is impossible.

Speaking to a pastor about his churches connections with the community; he said it scared him to look out into his community, as the needs were just too great, that he felt paralyzed.

The question is simple: What impact is the church having on the community?

Jesus Christ was a daring bridge builder of another kind. Against his own overwhelming odds, he imagined a bridge of unprecedented spiritual influence—one that could span a chasm roaring with skepticism, indifference, hostility, even persecution. He imagined a bridge able to connect his people—"my church," he called them—to a disbelieving, disinterested world.

BRIDGES OF LOVE MINISTRY

Fifteen years ago, God gave me a vision...to connect the church with the community in which it was found. The bridge to make that connection was unknown. but God opened a window with the invitation from the Evangelical Fellowship of Canada to join their National Evangelism Roundtables. That invitation created a door of opportunity, which has blossomed over the years into two very valuable bridges. The Faith Emergency Preparedness Initiative (FEPI) and Community Emergency

Response Team (CERT) training.



We can no longer simply afford to stand on one side of the great chasm and shout to those on the other side. We must connect! Otherwise, the greatest unbridged chasm will remain the gap between the stunning vision of Jesus Christ and the ever-receding influence of the church in the world. We cannot exist for ourselves, but must embrace our highest calling: to bridge the great chasm being salt and light in a needy and searching world.

LOVE IS ACTION – February, 2019

"AND AT MIDNIGHT A CRY RANG OUT: HERE'S THE BRIDEGOOM! COME OUT TO MEET HIM" Matthew 25:6

And at midnight there was a cry made, Behold, the bridegroom comes; go you out to meet him.



Jesus told parables to clarify what it means to be ready for His return and how to live until he comes. The story of the ten virgins in Matthew 25 verses 14-30 teaches that every person is responsible for his or her own spiritual condition.

The parable is about a wedding. On the wedding day the bridegroom went to the bride's house for the ceremony; then the bride and groom, along with a great procession, returned to the groom's house where a feast took place.

The ten virgins were waiting to join the procession, as they hoped to take part in the wedding banquet. But when the groom didn't come on schedule, five of them were out of lamp oil. By the time they purchased extra oil, it was too late to join the festivities.


Five of the virgins, were foolish, and five were wise. All ten had a job to do. They had lamps. The lamps were supposed to be ready, ignited when He comes. Light. "Prepare the way of the Lord."

When Jesus returns to take His people to heaven, we must be ready. Spiritual preparation cannot be bought or borrowed at the last minute. Our relationship with the Lord must be our own.

INFLUENZA PANDEMIC...READY OR NOT

On October 8, 1918, military officials hastily moved fifteen ill Canadian soldiers travelling through Calgary on a Canadian Pacific transport train into isolation unit at a nearby army base. A thoroughly nineteenth-century approach to disease containment. The quarantine didn't work, and Calgary was soon inundated with infected civilians.



Over one hundred years has passed since the 1918 Spanish Flu pandemic which felled nearly as many Canadians as the preceding war. Indeed, perhaps the most important legacy of the 1918 pandemic is that it marked the waning of the thinking that had dominated Canadian publichealth practice for generations: that the vector of infectious diseases could be halted using isolation, exclusion, and sanitary reform. The federal department of health, laid the basis for a new ideology of public health governance, one that saw disease as a community problem, not only an individual hardship or a plague brought on by outsiders. We have learned a lot over the past 100 years and are better prepared because of it. But make no mistake, outbreaks of sudden, unexpected, and localized eruptions of infection are inevitable. Dr. Sanjay Gupta, Chief Medical Correspondent.

"<u>Unseen Enemy</u>", a documentary written and directed by Janet Tobias was released in 2017. Tobias collaborated with some of the world's top pathogen hunters and medical professionals for more than three years, tracking outbreaks of Zika, Ebola and influenza worldwide.

Tobias' film makes the case that successful containment can be achieved with coordinated efforts of medical professionals, researchers, governments, communicators, and the public.

THE STORY OF AN EARTHQUAKE AND THE CHRISTIANS WHO STAYED

Immediately following the 2011 disaster, a great number of local and overseas volunteers came to the tsunami-ravaged Tohoku seacoast. However, a few months later—when evacuation centers began to close, water and food distribution became unnecessary, and the work of removing tsunami mud from houses largely came to an end—most volunteers and support organizations stopped coming; but not Christian volunteers.

They worked through local churches and continued to support people affected by the disaster, even after people had moved from evacuation centers into temporary housing. Christians were aware that those suffering were dealing not just with physical needs such as clothing, food, and housing—they were also dealing with spiritual needs, as they wrestled with the loss of loved ones and possessions that had been dear to them.



As Christians continue visiting the affected people, they are known as Mr/Ms Christ with respect and appreciation.

LOVE IS ACTION – March, 2019

"THOUGH THE MORE ABUNDANTLY I LOVE YOU, THE LESS I BE LOVED" 2 Corinthians 12:15

"And I will very gladly spend and be spent for you; though the more abundantly I love you, the less I be loved." ~Corinthians 12:15

Natural human love expects something in return. But Paul is saying, "It doesn't really matter to me whether you love me or not. I am willing to be completely destitute anyway; willing to be poverty-stricken, not just for your sakes, but also that I may be able to get you to God." And Paul's idea of service was the same as our Lord's. He did not care how high the cost was to himself— he would gladly pay it.

Christ's idea is that we serve Him by being the servants of others. Jesus Christ actually "outsocialized" the socialists. He said that in His kingdom the greatest one would be the servant of all (see Matthew 23:11). The real test of a saint is not one's willingness to preach the gospel, but one's willingness to do something like washing the disciples' feet— that is, being



willing to do these things that seem unimportant in human estimation but count as everything to God. Paul's was lt delight to spend his life for God's interests in other people, and he did not care what it cost. Before we

are willing to serve, we stop to ponder our personal and financial concerns, indicating we have reservations about serving God.

But the apostle Paul had no conditions or reservations. Paul focused his life on Jesus Christ's idea of a New Testament saint; that is, not one who merely proclaims the gospel, but one who becomes broken bread and pouredout wine in the hands of Jesus Christ for the sake of others.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL AID ACT

Province of Alberta

Protection from action

2 If, in respect of a person who is ill, injured or unconscious as the result of an accident or other emergency,

- (a) a physician, registered health discipline member, or registered nurse voluntarily and without expectation of compensation or reward renders emergency medical services or first aid assistance and the services or assistance are not rendered at a hospital or other place having adequate medical facilities and equipment, or
- (b) a person other than a person mentioned in clause (a) voluntarily renders emergency first aid assistance and that assistance is rendered at the immediate scene of the accident or emergency, the physician, health discipline registered member, registered nurse or other person is not liable for damages for injuries to or the death of that person alleged to have been caused by an act or omission on his or her part in rendering the medical services or first aid assistance, unless it is established that the injuries or death were caused by gross negligence on his or her part. RSA 1980 cE-9 s2;RSA 1980 cH-5.1 s34;1984 c53 s27

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training educates volunteers about disaster preparedness for the hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. CERT offers a consistent. nationwide approach to volunteer training and organization that professional responders can rely on during disaster situations, which allows them to focus on more complex tasks. Through CERT, the capabilities to prepare for, respond to, and recover from disasters, is built and enhanced.

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LOVE IS ACTION – April, 2019


"I AM THE WAY AND THE TRUTH AND THE LIFE..." John 14:6

RISKS THAT COULD HIT CALGARY

The Calgary Emergency Management Agency has created an interactive <u>Disaster</u> <u>Risk Explorer website</u> to help Calgarians understand what disasters could hit the city and how to prepare.

The 13 disasters ranked as highest risk are:

- Catastrophic flooding of the Bow River.
- Catastrophic flooding of the Elbow River.
- Extreme cold.
- Major critical infrastructure failure or disruption.
- Major dam breach on the Bow River.
- Major drought.
- Major hostage incident.
- Mass casualty attack.
- Major rail incident.
- Blizzard.
- Heavy rainstorm.
- Winter storm.
- Tornado.

The site shares that these are the 13 highest risk disasters Calgary could face, out of 65 natural and man-made crises reviewed and ranked by the city's emergency management agency.

The website outlines just how likely each disaster is, what the consequences could be to the city, and how people can prepare for the worst.

"This is an absolutely foundational piece of work," said Sue Henry, Deputy Chief of the Calgary Emergency Management Agency.

"Because it's a shared responsibility, we need citizens to be ready to take care of themselves and their families, we need them to have a kit for 72 hours, so we can focus resources on those people that are truly in life threatening condition."

South Centre Mall Emergency Fair May 11, 2019



"IF YOU TAKE THE LEFT, THEN I WILL GO TO THE RIGHT." Genesis 13:9

THE GOOD OR THE BEST?

If you take the left, then I will go to the right; or, if you go to the right, then I will go to the left. GENESIS 13:9

As soon as you begin to live the life of faith in God. fascinating and physically gratifying possibilities will open up before you. These things are yours by right, but if you are living the life of faith you will exercise your right to waive your rights, and let God make your choice for you. God sometimes allows you to get into a place of testing where your own welfare would be the appropriate thing to consider, if you were not living the life of faith. But if you are, you will joyfully waive your right and allow God to make your choice for you. This is the discipline God uses to transform the natural into the spiritual through obedience to His voice.

Whenever our *right* becomes the guiding factor of our lives, it dulls our spiritual insight. The greatest enemy of the life of faith in God is not sin, but good choices which are not quite good enough. The good is always the enemy of the best. In this passage, it would seem that the wisest thing in the world for Abram to do would be to choose. It was his right, and the people around him would consider him to be a fool for not choosing.

Many of us do not continue to grow spiritually because we prefer to choose on the basis of our rights, instead of relying on God to make the choice for us. We have to learn to walk according to the standard which has its eyes focused on God. And God says to us, as He did to Abram, "...walk before Me..." Genesis 17:1.

MOVING ON... Matthew 10:14

A letter from the Willow Creek Ministerial helped Bridges of Love make a difficult decision and also aided in understanding.

"We see the proactive emergency training (CERT) that Bridges of Love would provide as good, but it might be a hindrance to current emergency structures. What we mean by hindrance is that CERT trained individuals are not recognized by local or provincial authorities -- this could create liability issues.

Additionally, we need to have a clear communication network, as you mention in your Bridges of Love document, regarding the Faith Emergency Preparedness Initiative. The intentions of the (FEPI) is to operate separately yet in conjunction with the Town of Claresholm Emergency Preparedness Policy. We don't see how effective the CERT training or FEPI could be if training is not recognized by the Town of Claresholm. As wellintentioned as these emergency training options may be, the end result could create confusion rather than the care originally intended.

After much conversation and prayer, the Willow Creek Ministerial has decided to be under the direction of the Town of Claresholm Emergency policies."

When we first began our work with the Faith Emergency Preparedness Initiative (2006), Public Safety Canada was solidly behind this initiative as were many sectors of both health and emergency management. We did truly work together through our FEPI Advisory Council. Collaboration was key!

Somewhere along the line, however, we lost this critical structure to give credibility and strength to our efforts. After our experiences trying to broaden our efforts to Southern Alberta, it has become clear that without support from government, community and church leaders; our efforts would be mediocre at best. Cheer-leaders are indeed critical to encourage community members to engage.

Public Safety Canada's award and continued support affirms we must press on.

EMERGENCY READY IN CANADA

This past week, while browsing Facebook, I was pleasantly surprised to come across a photo taken in 2018 by Public Safety Canada, while accepting their Emergency Management Exemplary Service Award. "Emergency Ready in Canada" high-lites on-line emergency preparedness news & tools.

Margaret Pollon founded the Bridges of Love Ministry in 2004, which provides Community Emergency Response Team training for volunteers who want the capacity to positively respond in times of disaster. Following the 2013 Alberta floods, the Bridges of Love Ministry coordinated a virtual donation website connecting donors, flood victims and volunteers. Mrs. Pollon's work to develop an integrated network of local churches has also enhanced community resilience. LINK

"THE TEACHING OF ADVERSITY"

"I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." John 16:33

Being a follower of Christ does not mean we are free from adversity. On the contrary, it actually means being delivered in adversity. As a follower of Christ for many years, I can say with certainty that we will encounter adversities, but Jesus says we should not be surprised when they come.

God does not give us overcoming life—He gives us life as we overcome. The challenges of life are what builds our strength. If there is no stress, there will be no strength. Once we accept and face life as it comes, God will give us the strength for each moment.

Last month, I shared in our July Newsletter that we were moving from Claresholm after a year of residency. Our decision was based on lack of support for Bridges of Love's initiatives from the town and church community. We loved our home but more importantly was our desire to continue to serve through Bridges of Love.

Our decision has taken a toll, however, as on June 30, a week before our scheduled move date, my husband Tom suffered a major heart attack. His life could have ended on that fitful day, but we believe God still has work for us to accomplish. A miracle was sent in just 4 minutes by a Calgary Ambulance that just happened to be in Claresholm and was about ready to head back when our call came in. That quick response probably saved my husband Tom's life or prevented severe heart damage.

Tom was taken to the Foothills Cardiac ICU where he remained until July 5; waiting for triple by-pass surgery. With a house to pack for the move, I remained at home while Tom was in the hospital, leaving visitation to our children and other family members.

It was indeed a very chaotic and confusing time for us both, as we struggled with feelings of doubt, over our pending move. Our house was sold, however, and we had purchased a condo in High River so there was no turning back. We had to trust God for our lives, for His purposes to unfold, and for His strength to get us through.

Thankfully, all went smoothly with the surgery and Tom was released Tuesday morning, three days after open heart surgery and four days before our move to High River. Leaving the hospital, we stopped by our Lawyer's office in Calgary, to sign the papers for our new residence, did a walk-through of our condo in High River, and then headed back to Claresholm.

We thank the many who prayed for us and the kind cards of support. We also thank our children who helped with packing and spent time with their Dad while he waited for surgery. Another answer to prayer came through our neighbour, Sharon. Sharon brought food, helped pack, and welcomed Tom into their home on moving day, so he wouldn't have to be in the midst of the chaos. In addition, Sharon and neighbour Cathy came over after the move was completed, and insured the duplex was ready for the new owners. At 79 and 75 years old they certainly were an answer to prayer and will be missed.

After three weeks in High River, we are settling in to our new surroundings and our tranquil setting is healthy for both heart and soul. "LABOURING TOGETHER WITH GOD"

"What, after all, is Apollos? And what is Paul? Only servants, through whom you came to believe—as the Lord has assigned to each his task. I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God made it grow. So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who makes things grow. The man who plants and the man who waters have only purpose, and each will be rewarded according to his own labor. For we are God's fellow workers, you are God's field, God's building." 1 Corinthians 3:6-9

The word labor in Greek is kopiaw kopiao kopee-ah'-o It means to 1) to grow weary, tired, exhausted (with toil or burdens or grief) 2) to labour with wearisome effort, to toil.

Laboring for the Lord requires *strength of desire*. God's work involves many different individuals with a variety of gifts and abilities. As team members performing our own special roles, we are useful members of God's team by setting aside our own desire to receive glory for what we accomplish, and seek approval from God alone. Do we use our abilities and spiritual gifts to build up others or do we keep them tied to ourselves?

God allows us to be co-labourers with Him in His great work on this earth. Working together with the Lord allows for *diversity* in our service but in the end it is God who gives the increase.

As co-labourerss we have *unity* in our purpose as we are all part of God's great plan. We must have the same view as we are merely servants and Jesus is the Lord of the harvest.

As co-labourers, we must also reflect *humility* of spirit. It in only through our sovereign God that saved us and commanded us to labour with Him. Only He can bless our human efforts so lives are saved.

Not only does God want us to be co-labourers in saving souls but He wants us to exhibit the fruits of the spirit produced in our individual lives (Galatians 5:22-23).

LABOUR DAY— WHY DO WE CELEBRATE?

Although Labour Day has evolved into just another long week-end marking the end of summer holidays, its origin celebrates the achievements of works. Its origins can be traced to the labour union movement, specifically the 8 hour day movement, which advocated eight hours of work, eight hours of recreation, and eight hours of rest each day. Labour Day is observed around the world by countries on various dates.

In Canada, it began as a massive workingclass demonstration in Toronto triggered by the rapidly and dramatically changing economic and industrialized landscape. Automated machinery began to replace manual labour and the special skills offered by workers were no longer as valuable or efficient. Complaints about long working hours, unsafe working conditions and low working wages generally resulted in job loss or demotion. Unions were illegal in Canada, as archaic British labour laws were still in effect at the time, so workers were subject to the authority of their employers or forced to find work elsewhere.



No matter where you find yourself this Labour Day, please take a moment to reflect upon Canada's labour pioneers. Their actions laid the foundations for future labour movements and helped works secure the rights and benefits enjoyed today.

THE SPEED OF TRUST

Stephen M.R. Covey

Collaboration does indeed require a high level of trust to be successful and trust is the glue that holds stakeholders together.

Stephen M.R. Covey covers this topic well in "The Speed of Trust." He establishes the essence of what trust is and how it can be developed and kept. He teaches that only organizations with a sterling level of trust garner a culture of true commitment. When an organization trusts its leaders, and everyone becomes trustworthy, then people can operate synergistically and non-defensively, which get the best results with greater speed.

Trust is the foundation of relationships. Without trust there can be no loyalty—and without loyalty there can be no true growth. Investing in integrity and strength of character can only heighten solid relationships.

"While corporate scandals, terrorist threats, office politics, and broken relationships have created low trust on almost every front, I contend that the ability to establish, grow, extend, and restore trust is not only vital to our personal and interpersonal well-being; it is a key leadership competency of the new global economy." Stephen Covey

Simply put, trust means confidence. When you trust people, you have confidence in them—in their integrity and in their abilities. When we distrust people, we are suspicious of them—of their integrity, their agenda, their capabilities, or their track record.

Can we increase trust? Mr. Covey says we can certainly increase trust—much faster than we might think—and doing so will have a huge impact, both in the quality of our lives and in the results we're able to achieve.

Why is trust an important element for Bridges of Love? As we embark our ministry in a new locality, it is critical to have the trust with those whom we serve and collaborate. Low trust slows every decision, every communication, and every relationship. Our desire is to build a culture of TRUST that will produce results, confidence, and loyalty.

TRUSTING GOD

Once in a faraway place lived a man who had faith in God. One night, while sleeping soundly, a sound woke him and a light filled his room. God appeared telling him to push a large rock outside his house, with all his might.

The next morning he went outside and pushed the rock but was not able to move it an inch. He didn't give up, however, as from that day forward he made it his routine to push that rock daily.

For many years he toiled from sun up to sun down, his shoulders set squarely against the cold, massive surface of the large rock. Each night he returned to his cabin sore and worn out.

Not seeing any progress, the man started to get discouraged. The man prayed to God asking, why after laboring hard and long, he was unable to move the rock? What was he doing wrong, and why was he failing?

God appeared saying "I asked you to serve me and you accepted. I asked you to push that rock but I never said that I expected you to move it! Look at yourself! Your arms are strong and muscled your back sinewy and brown.

Facing opposition you have grown and your abilities surpass what they were. You have not moved the rock but your calling was to be obedient, to exercise your faith, and TRUST in My Wisdom."

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
