Returning home, a brief stop was made in Carstairs to drop off a bag of candy for The Rock Church's Christmas celebration. It was a full two days of travel! We give thanks to the Lord for His protection, as we just missed the storm that hit that area with vengeance just hours after we passed through. God is good!

As you will see in the MVC CERT Summit poster, Laura Stewart, a wildfire specialist from FireSmart agreed to present this timely topic for our Friday evening session. With a very dry winter to date, the time is now to anticipate and prepare for another severe wildfire season. As with all disaster responses, we plan for the worst-case scenario but pray for the best!

Having local CERT instructors from Mountain View County is our goal, providing opportunities for other training sessions in this county, duplicating Bridges of Love's model by engaged residents.



We are very grateful to have Randy Smith, a retired Fire Chief who lives in Olds, instructing the Fire Safety and Search and Rescue modules. We are now seeking additional professionals to present the Disaster Medical Operations Units 1 & 2; Psychology of Trauma, CERT & Terrorism, and Personal Preparedness sessions. We will deliver the manuals to individuals who are willing to give back to their communities by volunteering their services as a CERT trainer with our heartfelt appreciation! Each module is 1,5 hrs. so the emergency training information is basic for Neighbours helping Neighbours!



LOVE IS ACTION – March, 2024

"TWO ARE BETTER THAN ONE" Ecclesiastes 4:9



Working together has many advantages! God intended and we are designed for companionship, not isolation, for intimacy, not loneliness. Building trusting relationships takes time and intentionality. We are not here on earth to serve ourselves but to serve God and seek others as team members.

Bridges Community of Love's Emergency Response Team (CERT) training is intended as basic emergency instruction for community members to work together; building strength and resilience when disaster strikes. Building a bridge to stand in the gap until the first responders arrive on the scene, offers assurance, that help is forthcoming immediately following a devastating event. It is a practical plan, but the logistics of creating a workable model can be challenging!

What does it take for "Neighbours helping Neighbours" to be feasible? CERT teams are comprised of trained graduates who are committed to being ready to not only help themselves and their families, but they are ready to assist in the community where they live. Can you imagine communities with 5 - 10 CERTs who continue to exercise what they learned through the CERT Summits, so they are ready to respond with confidence, coordination, equipment, and know-how?

MOUNTAIN VIEW COUNTY CERT SUMMIT UPDATE

After completing the Mountain View County CERT Summit, we are pleased to report that our graduates all expressed a desire to be part of a CERT team in their communities. The evaluation results were very positive with strong support for the training and capable instructors. The Friday evening keynote speaker (Wildfire Specialist) was exceptional, sharing information that was very applicable for the season and present conditions.

Our only struggle was finding adequate participants who were willing to give up two Saturdays and a Friday evening to attend. Varying marketing methods were undertaken with personal visitations, poster & brochure distribution, radio and newspaper ads, newsletters, our website, social media, and the local radio station in Olds interviewed to hear more about the event coming to their town. Three months of planning and preparing with three individuals registered! How do we stimulate more participation for an activity that can save lives and protect property?

Even though our numbers were small we had great participants! Two attendees were from Carstairs, and one came from Olds. Our training teaches that CERTs do not respond on their own, and as mentioned, preferably 5 - 7 cert grads are on a team. Greater participation is necessary to build sustainability for a community response but even though we have three new great CERT graduates, we hope to have a stronger show for our next CERT training event.

Now is the time to consider attending Bridges of Love's next CERT Canada Summit. We realize it is a commitment to take time for this activity, but remember that when disaster strikes, the time to prepare has passed! CERT 'BEARING TOGETHER' TEAM MEMBERS


Emergencies and disasters in Alberta are becoming more frequent, more complex, and are in need of a comprehensive, efficient, and cost-effective response and recovery strategy.

The Wildfire Season that Shocked the World

A calm prevailed before the firestorm... Canada awaited the start of wildfire season. It was the end of April. The annual battle of the blazes was not expected to begin in earnest for weeks, maybe even two months in a good year. But it would soon become clear that the 2023 season would be anything but good.

On April 30, the first "wildfire of note" - meaning it could threaten public safety or critical infrastructure—popped up in Alberta. About an hour's drive west of the capital city of Edmonton, near the hamlet of

Entwistle, a fire devoured tinderbox-dry trees and grass. A few minutes away a second

wildfire of note burned simultaneously. This one cropped up closer to the hamlet of Evansburg. Humorously known for electing a 'town grouch' in past years. There was nothing funny, however, about what was about to occur. Something had sparked Albera's first two notable fires of the year, igniting a wildfire season across Canada unlike any other.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS WEEK

Take action so that you, your family, and your community are prepared for emergencies.

Emergency Preparedness Week (EP Week) is a national event supported by Public Safety Canada, working closely with and provincial territorial emergency management Indiaenous organizations. organizations, non-governmental organizations, private and sector organizations who support activities at the local level.



Everyone has a role to play in an emergency. EP Week is an opportunity for you to take action to ensure you are prepared to protect yourself, your family and your community during an emergency. This year, the theme "**Be Prepared. Know Your Risks**". encourages Canadians to understand the risks in their area and learn what actions they can take to protect themselves and their families.

We forward to another opportunity to share at the Okotoks Emergency Preparedness Week event taking place May 11, 2024, on the north side of 99 Okotoks Drive from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm. CERT Graduates please consider joining us for another great day with the community! We will be sharing resources from the Wildfire Management Branch, Forestry Division, Alberta Forestry and Parks to assist with the wildfire season which is predicted to be severe.

WILDFIRE SEASON

Wildfire season runs from March 1 to October 31 in Alberta, which means fire permits are required for activities such as residential, industrial or agricultural debris burning. Albertans living in the Forest Protection Area can get a fire permit through your local forest area office.

Alberta is preparing for an intense 2024 wildfire season. A sweeping fire restriction has been put in place across Alberta as hot, dry weather leaves forests tinder-dry. Emergency officials are urging extreme caution in the weeks ahead as a persistent and severe drought pushes Alberta's wildfire danger to the extreme.

Fine particles in the air from wildfires can get deep into people's lungs and bloodstream and cause inflammation. Those with asthma, COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease), or other chronic lung diseases are at increased risk of additional inflammation and may become wheezy or short of breath.

Steps to help support health and protect lungs from damage: Drink plenty of water, drink hot liquids, use saline nasal spray, and rinse sinuses with Neti Pot.

"YOUR KINGDOM COME, YOUR WILL BE DONE, ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN" Matthew 6:10


OUR KINGDOM COME. OUR WILL BE DONE, ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN

"FORGET THE FORMER THINGS; DO NOT DWELL ON THE PAST." Isaiah 43:18-19


"WHERE THERE IS NO VISION, THE PEOPLE PERISH" Proverbs 29:18

"ENJOY HARDSHIP WITH US LIKE A GOOD SOLDIER OF CHRIST JESUS" 2 Timothy 2:3

A SINGLE POPPY HAS THE SOUL OF A THOUSAND HEROES AND THE TEARS OF A MILLION LOVED ONES LEST WE FORGET

As Remembrance Day draws near, we think of those men and women who fought for our country with courage and valour. As followers of Jesus Christ, we too must stand strong with courage. Suffering, and enduring hardship for the sake of Christ, was the expectation of the person who sought to live fully for God. Timothy was to suffer "as a good soldier of Christ Jesus." Paul did not have violence in mind, but rather the attitude of a welltrained soldier.

Enduring hardness means we should not allow ourselves to become easily discouraged. We must always be prepared for conflict and should not back down from the enemy's threats. Paul warns Timothy of the way men will behave in the last days before Christ's return. Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Empowering Our Community FELICIA'S FEATURE

Settling into my role at Bridges of Love, the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program was introduced. Coming from an emergency response background, I understand the uncertainty civilians face in crises. Many well-meaning individuals may inadvertently put themselves in dangerous situations when attempting to help. CERT provides basic vet essential training that empowers participants to manage their safety and assist their neighbours until professional responders arrive.

One of the most valuable aspects of CERT is its focus on practical, basic training that prepares people to help themselves and their neighbours during disasters. Many people may think they need advanced training or specialized skills to make a difference, but CERT demonstrates that anyone can contribute effectively. This program helps bridge the gap between good intentions and real, actionable support during a crisis.

One of the key benefits of CERT training is that it establishes clear rules and a code of conduct for members. This structure not only ensures that participants operate within their training limits but also promotes professionalism and safety. Members are trained to prioritize their own safety and to assist only until professional responders arrive. This structured approach not only enhances personal safety but also fosters a sense of community.

CERT is an excellent reminder that we all have the potential to contribute to our community's resilience. If you're interested in learning more about how you can get involved, I encourage you to explore what CERT has to offer.
