


LOVE IS ACTION – December, 2018

"FOR WHERE YOUR TREASURE IS, THERE YOUR HEART WILL BE ALSO." Matthew 6:21



Jesus is clear that having treasures not focused on Him, leads our hearts in the wrong direction. What we treasure the most is what controls us! Jesus calls for a decision that allows us to live contentedly with whatever we have and to place eternal values over temporary, earthly treasures.

In 1677, twenty-seven year old Henry Scougal wrote this to a friend: "The worth and excellency of a soul is to be measured by the object of its love" (The Life of God in the Soul of Man, 20).

It is difficult to dismiss where our pleasures lie because pleasure is the measure of our treasure. We know that what we truly treasure is what we really love. Henry Scougal was right: the object of our love, the treasure we passionately want, measures the worth and condition of our soul.

Have we lost our first love and the power of God?

Do we have little or no time with Jesus; more concerned with ourselves and our personal desires than concerned about the things that concern Him? Are we willing to give our time, energy, and money to a sporting event or some sort of entertainment, than to the things of God?

It is a dangerous thing to go through the motions of Christianity without a passionate love for Christ. What Jesus wants is for us to love Him like He loves us. He demonstrated that love for us on the cross when He suffered and died for us, bearing our sins on Calvary's cross. Not because he was forced to, but because of His love for us and His desire to bring us into relationship with the Father.

We know the things and pleasures of this life are temporal and the older we become, the quicker this life passes. This Christmas season, let us go back to when we first met Jesus, remembering the love we felt and the adoration we had for the Saviour – back to our first LOVE.

CALIFORNIA WILD FIRES, 2018

"This event was the worst-case scenario," Butt County Sheriff Kory Honea said, "It's the event that we have feared for a long time."



Reading the many accounts from the latest devastating California wild-fires, one story particularly stood out. It was regarding a son searching for his 75 year old mother, a widow whose house burned down, along with the rest of her neighbourhood. She lived alone and did not drive.

The son posted a flyer on social media, pinned it to bulletin boards at shelters, and showed her picture to evacuees asking if anyone recognized her. He ran across a few of her neighbours, but no one had seen her.

As he drove through the smoke and haze to yet another shelter, his thoughts were on the worst case scenario, but he knew she was a smart resourceful woman, so he held out hope of finding her...

As I read this account from one member of the devastated community, I wondered if the outcome could have been different if a CERT member lived in close proximity. Would she be safe in an evacuation centre, due to the efforts of a trained volunteer, who took the time to learn basic emergency skills and information to assist in times of disaster? CERTs are trained to know their community, and who might be the most vulnerable and need an extra hand, should a catastrophic event happen in their locality.

The Alert Ready system was developed with many partners, including federal, provincial, and territorial emergency management officials, Environment and Climate Canada, Pelmorex, the broadcasting industry and wireless service providers.

Together these providers work to ensure Canadians receive alerts immediately to know when to take action to stay safe.

What should I do if I receive an emergency alert?


✓ Upon receiving an emergency alert it is important to take action safely. Alerting authorities will include within the emergency alert the information you need, including any action you need to take. This could include, but is not limited to: limit unnecessary travel, evacuate areas, shelter-in-place, etc.

SUFFERING PRODUCES PERSEVERANCE... Romans 4:5

CANADA'S PLATFORM FOR DISASTER RISK REDUCTION

Canada's Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) was established in 2009 as a multistakeholder national mechanism that coordinates and advises on areas of propriety requiring concerted action. It has national oversight and leadership and is comprised of more than 700 members representing local to national levels of governance, multiple sectors and organizations to provide a whole-of-society perspective to reducing risk.

In 2015, along with 186 other countries from all over the world, Canada endorsed a post-2015 Hyogo Framework, known as the United Nations Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (2015-2030). DRR is defined as a systematic, whole-of-society approach to identifying, assessing and analyzing the causal effects of disasters and disaster based on risk assessment.

Public Safety Canada hosts an Annual National Roundtable for Disaster Risk Reduction, which provides a valuable opportunity for discussion on implementing the Sendai Framework.

VISION

 A safer and more resilient Canada through the reduction of risks and leveraging of capacities and opportunities across all levels of government, the private sector, academia, non-governmental organizations, professional associations, Indigenous groups, and the general public.

OBJECTIVES

- To work in an integrated manner to reduce risk, vulnerability and impacts of natural and non-natural disasters to Canadians;
- Provide a coordinating mechanism for DRR across sectors and using our existing networks; and
- To support stakeholders with relevant knowledge and information.

GOT IT COVERED!!

In recent years, Alberta has been ground zero for unprecedented losses, in Canada.


Glenn McGillivray, managing director of the Institute for Catastrophic Loss Reduction, reported in the <u>Globe and Mail</u>, May 2018, six out of 10 natural disasters (events that caused a minimum \$25-million of insured damage) have taken place in Alberta, with the biggest currently sitting at \$3.6-billion insured. Seven of the top 10 costliest natural catastrophes in Canadian history have occurred in Alberta, generating \$8.2-billion in insured damage and considerably larger economic losses. All have occurred since 2009.

He goes on to say, while we cannot stop the wind from blowing, the rain from falling or lightning from igniting the boreal, we most certainly can take action to prevent a natural event from intersecting with the built environment and becoming a disaster.

The next question, of course, is how?

He states, the answer lies in the implementation of a holistic program for natural-disaster mitigation that involves many stakeholders, including all levels of government, academia, private industry, and property owners.

This must be addressed to have any hope of taming the trend to more and larger losses related to severe weather in Alberta. We cannot have business as usual!

"LET NOT YOUR HEART BE TROUBLED"

John 14:1

"Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also. John 14:1-3

Jesus' words show that the way to eternal life, is prepared and secure. These verses are rich with promises for what He has prepared for those that believe and love Him. Our life and eternal destiny with God is secure through Jesus Christ.

For the past year, we have been praying for God to prepare a place for Bridges of Love. We were initially looking for a home where we could live as well as have room for the ministry. Six months ago we came across a former Law Office that appeared perfect for the ministry with a generous basement that could be finished as our residence. After looking into this possibility, however, we could not purchase this Commercial property personally unless we rezoned and then they would not let us make any changes to build a suite downstairs. Bridges of Love would have to purchase the property to make it feasible.

We were told properties did not move too quickly in Claresholm, so we felt confident God would save the property until we had our funds in place. Fund raising efforts immediately went into action through "Operation Stone Soup." Our first activity to raise awareness of our intentions was an invitation to introduce Bridges of Love to the Claresholm Ministerial. There was good attendance at their meeting where the vision for Bridges of Love and The Shepherd's Staff was shared. We were indeed optimistic that this was God's plan and we were being obedient.

ANSWERED PRAYER

After two years of ups and downs trying to sell our one bedroom condominium in Calgary, it finally sold June 10. So much prayer had gone into this sale from many, so we were all giving praise to the Lord for answered prayer, believing His timing was perfect. The buyer wanted possession on July 4 so that gave three weeks to pack and find another residence. Since the Shepherd's Staff was clearly what God had called us to, we knew Claresholm was our destination. Once we were settled, we would step-up our fund-raising efforts for the former Law office.

A duplex with a finished basement was purchased as our home and temporary location for Bridges of Love. Since our office belongings were stored for over a year, we wanted to move it from the MI Box as soon as possible, in order to not incur more expense.

Upon arriving in Claresholm, a stop was made at the Post Office, to secure a Postal Box #. The Post Office, located across the street from the former Law office, was also next to the Real Estate Company that listed the property. The 'For Sale' sign was laying on the grass so we made an inquiry whether there was any interest in the property. Much to our disappointment, we were told the property just sold and the sign would be going up shortly. By the time we drove away, the sign was indeed posted, July 4th, our moving day.

Even though this news was not what we planned for or expected; God ways are not our ways. We know He has us and Bridges of Love here for His purposes. Oswald Chamber's daily devotional for July 4th read... "Do not fret—it only causes harm" Psalm 37:8

Fretting rises from our determination to have our own way. Our Lord never worried and was never anxious, because His purpose was never to accomplish His own plans but to fulfill God's plans.

"OH, THAT YOU WOULD BLESS ME, AND ENLARGE MY TERRITORY!" 1 Chronicles 4:10

Jabez cried out to the God of Israel, "Oh, that you would bless me, and enlarge my territory! Let your hand be with me, and keep me from harm, so that I will be free from pain." And God granted his request.

1 Chronicles 4:9-10

Jabez is remembered by a prayer request rather than by a heroic act. In his prayer, he asked God to bless him, help him in his work (enlarge his territory), to be with him in all he did, and to keep him from harm. Jabez acknowledges God as the focal point and reason for his work.

"Sometime around three thousand years ago, one of history's great nobodies decided to pray. When he looked at himself and his circumstances, he saw no reason for hope. But when he prayed, he prayed the boldest, most hopeful prayer he could imagine. And God answered. God is still answering.

The prayer of a man named Jabez is motivating millions of people today to seek the Lord in a new way, to cry out to Him for blessing, and to reach for a larger life in His service. Are you one? Then you too are an answer to Jabez's prayer. Once you see what God can do through His most ordinary servants, you'll never want to slide back into mediocre living.

For too long, Christians have drastically underestimated God's desire to bless them and work through them to accomplish His will in the world. Enlarging Bridges of Love's Territory

For the past 14+ years, we were very fortunate of have our office located in St. John Lutheran Church (Bridgeland). It was indeed a special place where we were blessed and encouraged as we developed a ministry for God's Glory. Our goal and passion to connect church and community through emergency preparedness and training evolved to where we are today.

During the 2013 Alberta Floods, the Faith Emergency Preparedness Initiative (FEPI) was activated. Finding accommodation for 24 flood volunteers was a quick yet effective process, due to information stored in our Church Contact and Resource database, compiled prior to the disaster. FEPI Churches provided facilities with showers, another church provided cots, and others shared hot meals and man-power. Good did indeed come from a catastrophe.

Grants from the Calgary Foundation provided an opportunity to test the waters for Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training. After nine successful CERT Summits across Calgary, the template is tested and proved beneficial, to share with other localities.

St. John Lutheran Church closed its doors last June. The new church owners are over-flowing with youth so needed additional space for Sunday school rooms. We have, therefore, been operating from our one bedroom condo since leaving our church office.

After a year of prayer and searching most communities across Southern Alberta, a possible site was found in Claresholm. This former law office has potential for Bridges of Love's office, a CERT training center, as well as additional room for our residence. Our hope and prayer is that Bridges of Love can serve Calgary to Lethbridge from this central and high visibility location. <u>View</u>

This is truly a God sized project. We know disasters are on the rise, so there is urgency for communities, to be prepared and trained. We also believe God wants us to step out in faith to accomplish His agenda. We ask for your support to join us in prayer and action.

Earthquakes

You cannot prepare for everything, so it is important to know the hazards which are most prevalent in one's area. Preparation for those threats will give added protection for family and community. One such threat is earthquake.


An earthquake is a sudden slipping or movement of a portion of the Earth's crust or plates, caused by a sudden release of stresses. Earthquake epicenters are usually less than 25 miles below the Earth's surface and are accompanied and followed by a series of vibrations. Earthquakes occur without any obvious warning.

The reason earthquakes are such a risk is because shaking ground can:

- Cause buildings to move off of their foundations or collapse.
- Damage utilities, structures, and roads.
- Cause fires and explosions.
- Cause structural instability, such as dam failures that can trigger flash floods.

Historically, Alberta has been a seismically quiet part of North America. The federal government began serious monitoring of Alberta seismic activity in the mid-1960s.

An over-night earthquake on July 6, 2017 left some Calgarians shaken and stirred. Even though earthquake disaster is minimal in our locality, travel makes us more vulnerable, while visiting other parts of the world.



I SURVIVED THE MEXICO CITY EARTHQUAKE...THIS IS MY STORY

I was at home in Roma neighborhood when the 7.1 magnitude earthquake hit Mexico City on September 19, 2017, exactly 32 years after the 1985 tragedy that killed thousands. There was no warning that the quake was coming, despite the fact that the capital boasts one of the most advanced earthquake alarms in the world.

The first tremble from beneath the earth was minor, and I thought it was a truck passing or the metro slithering underneath—normal things that make the streets rumble in this megalopolis. But the second shock hit with a force that launched me to my feet. The house swayed and twisted as if it were made of paper, and the city erupted into a cacophony of sirens and sounds of destruction as I stumbled out the front door. Suddenly, I was shirtless and shoeless in the street with my neighbors, being thrown back and forth by the ground that seemed to turn to liquid.

As we reeled in the street, the smell of gas seeped out of the front gate of our vecindad, a condo-style building with small houses sharing a courtyard and a gated entrance. "Shut the gas and turn off the electricity, there's a leak!" shouted one neighbor.

The chaos and noise only growing until the city descended into total gridlock.

Looking back at the early church, the impact and accomplishments of the early believers was strong despite lack of adequate resources. They were very ordinary men and women for the most part, trying to make a difference, through fierce opposition. Despite severe persecution, they emerged victorious.

Today, in our setting, we have every resource imaginable to assist with our Christian walk, but there is still so many forces at war within us. Only through the peace of God can we overcome these hostile forces to bring comfort in place of conflict. Jesus says He will give us that peace if we are willing to accept it from Him.

The end result of the Holy Spirit's work in our lives is a deep and lasting peace. As we begin a New Year, most yearn for this peace through every circumstance, in our daily lives. True peace is not found in positive thinking, in absence of conflict, or in good feelings. It comes from knowing that God is in control and allowing Him to guard our hearts against anything that robs us of His everlasting peace.

So what was the secret of the early church? There was no secret. Their faith was a very simple one of God's people proclaiming the gospel in the power of the Holy Spirit...and confirming it with holy lives.

Are we missing the power and work of the Holy Spirit to unleash God's power to see transformed lives?

PREPAREDNESS + TRAINING = PEACE

Complacency is perhaps one of the biggest challenges we face in our emergency action plans. Immediately following a disaster, we are eager to improve in our emergency preparedness but it doesn't take long before we forget the experiences and planning efforts.

When it comes to personal safety, complacency can be a literal "killer" for each one of us. There is much danger in going into "autopilot" not worrying what tomorrow might bring. We only have to spend a little time looking back over the past ten years to see the trend that has emerged for disasters all over the world. This trend is the new norm so it is dangerous to put our preparedness planning on the back shelf in hopes that it is never needed.

Solution

One technique found to be effective in battling complacency is to investigate what the professionals say regarding personal and community preparedness. Before Christmas, Bridges of Love received a letter from the Honourable Ralph Goodale, Minister of Public Safety Canada expressing affirmation for CERT training.

"First allow me to congratulate you on the progress that you have made in developing a successful community training program and hosting nine CERT Summits over the past two years. strengthen emergency Initiatives to preparedness and response at the local level are critical for building resilient As I mentioned in my communities. statement on the International Day for Disaster Reduction, every one of us has a role to play in building a safer and more resilient society. I sincerely commend your contribution to this collective responsibility."
