


"BUT IF WE WALK IN THE LIGHT AS HE IS IN THE LIGHT" 1 John 1:7



"CALLING THE TWELVE TO HIM, HE SENT THEM OUT TWO BY TWO..."



AND JESUS CALLED TO HIM THE TWELVE, AND BEGAN TO SEND THEM OUT TWO BY TWO, AND GAVE THEM AUTHORITY OVER THE UNCLEAN SPIRITS. (MARK 6:7)

Jesus had a team of disciples who went everywhere with him. In this passage from Mark, Jesus sent his disciples out to begin doing their own ministry in team of two. - 2. "Similarly, what do you see as the biggest opportunity?"

Her response, "Communication! We know the first responders to disaster are always regular people - neighbours, passersby, family members. Helping people understand how to prepare, what to do, and how to recover will reduce risks, impacts and costs - both financial and human."





"DON'T LET ANYONE LOOK DOWN ON YOU BECAUSE YOU ARE YOUNG..." Timothy 4:12



In the book of Timothy, Paul gives encouragement and instruction to Timothy, a young leader. Timothy was one of Paul's closest companions. Paul sent Timothy to the church at Ephesus to counter the false teaching that had arisen there. Timothy probably served for a time as a leader in the church at Ephesus and Paul hoped to visit him.

When neighbours see the sign in the window indicating this church cares and loves their community, one never knows what may transpire!

FEPI churches have an option to become a "Crossroads" partner. Crossroads is a FEPI extension helping community members through the challenges that everyday life may bring!



"EACH OF YOU SHOULD USE WHATEVER GIFT YOU HAVE RECEIVED TO SERVE OTHERS" 1 Peter 4:10



As we celebrate 20 years serving through Bridges of Love Ministry, many memories come to mind; cherished memories that will never be forgotten! One of these occasions took place while participating in the Micah Challenge, a global initiative providing useful tools for congregations seeking depth and connection through new commitments for community outreach. Micah 6:8 calls us to act justly, to love mercy and to walk humbly with our God.

June 19, 2006, a group of Canadian and American Micah Challenge participants, along with many African nations; attended the Samaritan Strategy, an Eastern Africa Regional Training (Vision Conference) in Uganda. This compelling and transformational conference taught Biblical foundational truths for what God expects from His followers, which set the stage and direction, for building Bridges of Love.

As an exercise to practice the principles we were being taught, conference attendees were invited to consider an act of service, that could be shared with the Canadians and Americans in our group. As you can imagine, we didn't have many resources on which to draw, staying at a modest motel, not far from the conference centre. 

LOVE IS ACTION – September, 2023


"AND DON'T FORGET TO DO GOOD AND TO SHARE WITH THOSE IN NEED" Hebrews 13:16



With the recent devastation in Maui, our hearts go out to the many residents who have been impacted by the unexpected fires which destroyed lives and property in Lahaina. Yes, this catastrophic event is not in our backyard, but with the increased fires in Canada, there is heightened concern we cannot be complacent! Newscasts have interviewed many residents who are displaced with homes destroyed. Gratitude overflows for the assistance they have received.

Hebrews 13:16, says we are not to forget to do good and to share with those in need. These sacrifices are particularly pleasing to God, even when they go unnoticed by others. Giving without appreciation is difficult but in Matthew 6:2, Jesus teaches that when we give to the needy, we do not announce it with trumpets, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the street, to be honoured by men.

Since Bridges of Love has developed two new recovery extensions to our Faith Emergency Preparedness Initiative, please see the above flowchart for clarification of our structure. Past emergency programs have been focused on preparedness and training. We now are ready to offer on-line donation management recovery platforms which will help not only disaster victims (ALBERTA RECOVERS) but also those who are struggling in these challenging times (CROSSWALK). Managing donations has been a difficult task so this system works effortlessly, without stockpiling mounds of often unwanted items!

Our platforms are secure and confidential so anyone going through difficult times do not have to worry about confidential information being shared. FEPI churches who partner with Bridges of Love are invited to support Crosswalk. Once an account is made, churches can view the needs that have been posted and then decide if they are able to help. Perhaps the request is greater than one church can handle, so partnering with a neighbouring church, is always a viable option. Once the church decides, Bridges of Love shares the contact information of the person who posted the request. When the need is met, Bridges of Love is notified, to remove the post from the platform. The Crosswalk on-line recovery system is neat and expediate.

It may seem like a lot of information to take in, but once the program is used, the process becomes clear! We thank our summer computer science student, Timothy (TJ) Rugg who has been an exceptional JavaScript development and information technology summer student. TJ created a new onboarding process for our Faith Emergency Preparedness Initiative and developed the frontend functionality and backend database architecture for our two platforms. All this has been documented in an Operations Manual for future applications.
