The Importance of Having a Go Bag

When disaster strikes, there is often little or no warning. Wildfires, floods, tornadoes, severe storms, earthquakes, hazardous material incidents, and other emergencies can force families to leave their homes quickly. In such situations, having a prepared "go bag" can make a significant difference in your safety, comfort, and peace of mind.



A go bag is a portable emergency kit containing essential supplies that will help you and your family remain self-sufficient for at least 72 hours. Emergency responders may be overwhelmed during a major disaster, and it can take time before assistance becomes available. A well-prepared go bag ensures that you have the basic necessities needed to care for yourself during those critical first days.

Every member of the household should have access to a go bag, and the contents should be reviewed and updated regularly.
